Definitions, Abbreviations, and Interpretations

1. Throughout the document IEEE Computational Intelligence Student Branch Chapter (SBC62631B) - GHRCE is abbreviated to SBC.
2. Participation in the Start-O-Thon constitutes Participant's full and unconditional agreement to and acceptance of these Terms and Conditions ("Terms").
3. The term "you" refers to you, the "Participant" and your team members.
4. The term "Team Leader" refers to the contact person nominated by the team members for communication between SBC and Team.

General Rules

1. All participants were instructed to follow SBC's Code of Conduct.
2. You can only have a maximum of 4 members in your team.
3. Once registered, no changes can be made in the team.
4. The decisions made by the Judging Panel selected by the SBC are final.
5. Report any misconduct directly to SBC.
6. SBC reserves the right to disqualify participants at our discretion.
7. SBC reserves the right in their sole discretion to amend these Terms and Conditions.

Guidelines

1. Eligibility

- 1.1. The Hackathon is open to students, who are pursuing their full-time undergraduate/postgraduate education.
- 1.2. Selected team members need to upload their college ID as proof of eligibility.

2. Entries & Submissions

- 2.1. You can make only one entry as a team. Multiple submissions per team will **not** be allowed.
- 2.2. Each entry must be original.
- 2.3. Incomplete entries may be disqualified.
- 2.4. All the submissions must be done as directed by the SBC. Submissions after the deadline would not be entertained.
- 2.5. Submissions on platform(s) other than Devfolio would not be entertained.

3. Judging & Evaluation:

- 3.1. There are mainly 3 rounds in the Hackathon.
 - 3.1.1. Round 1: Business model and slide-deck submission
 - 3.1.2. Round 2: Video submission
 - 3.1.3. Round 3: Live Pitching
- 3.2. In round 1, the Business model and slide-deck submission will be evaluated by SBC.
- 3.3. Top 50 shortlisted teams will be contacted and informed via email.
- 3.4. For Round 2, Teams need to submit their video via directed channel.
- 3.5. The determination of the promotion of the team to the third round is 80% based on the internal evaluation and 20% based on mass voting.
- 3.6. Mass Voting: The demo videos submitted by the team will be uploaded on SBC's YouTube Channel. The video links will be sent to the participants. The team needs to promote their videos within a given time.
- 3.7. Top 15 Teams will be shortlisted for Round 3. In round 3, the team needs to pitch their idea live in front of judges and demonstrate it. The time given per team will be 5 minutes. Additional 2 minutes will be allotted for Questions from the judges.
- 3.8. The evaluation in this round will be solely judged by the judges.

4. Communication:

- 4.1. All the announcements will be notified through emails and Discord.
- 4.2. In case you have an urgent question, which deals with privileged or private information, you may directly message the organisers on the above stated official platforms.
- 4.3. You may expect the reply to your queries within 3 hours.
- 4.4. The Video call meetings will be hosted on Microsoft Teams only.
- 4.5. Please make sure you are familiar with all the above stated platforms.
- 4.6. Please make sure you are familiar with your recording software of choice and how to upload a video to YouTube.
- 4.7. By registering for Start-O-Thon, you and your team members agree to subscribe to our mailing list wherein you will receive the updates of our future events. However, you may unsubscribe it anytime by clicking on Unsubscribe link in the email footer or sending an email to info@ieee-cis-sbc.org.

5. Prizes and Winners:

- 5.1. Winners will be chosen according to the votes cast by the panel of judges and based on the criteria as mentioned in section 3 of this document.
- 5.2. The cash prizes for each of the winning teams are as follows:
 - 5.2.1. Winning Team: 20,000 INR
 - 5.2.2. First Runner Up team: 15,000 INR
 - 5.2.3. Second Runner Up team: 10,000 INR
- 5.3. The special prizes from gold sponsors will be awarded if participants use their platform.
- 5.4. The cash prize will be transferred to the Team Leader's account through National Electronic Fund Transfer (NEFT) mode only.
- 5.5. The online payments for the overseas winners will be done via Paypal.
- 5.6. The transactions will be done within 30 days of the announcement of final results.
- 5.7. The winners are personally responsible for any personal or incidental expenses incurred in claiming or using the prizes. The payment of prizes will be made without any taxes or levies.
- 5.8. It will be the Team Leader's responsibility to provide SBC with correct Bank Account details.

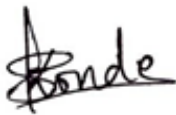
